Trip Reports - Glenlyon Dam


As always one of the year's best trips. Eleven club members, plus a couple of my mate. Bill Rudder from the sunshine coast, a ex member of the Brisbane club fishing with me, and in his own boat he towed down from Yeppoon, Bill Bowtell from the Keppel bay club, who some of you met at Kerry and at the November meeting. The weather, well typical of the Granite Belt, perfect one day, cold and raining the next, followed by strong SE winds, but we fished through it regardless. Thursday afternoon saw myself and the 2 Bill's on the water. A bit breezy, so we elected to spinnerbait the inlets on the

side opposite the caves. Bill pulled 4 Goldens on spinnerbaits. This was the only session where we caught fish casting. Whether coming off the full moon had anything to do with or the fact all the "experts" were arriving the next day. The number of undersize cod we caught in the first couple of sessions were in excess of the Goldens.

At the club meeting, Kev and I were trying to determine where the old weir was up near Glenrock Station. You might have seen us discussing it via google earth. My first guess was right. We found it on the sounder on the Friday morning, and on our 5th pass over it Bill R pulled a 75cm cod. It got fished a few times during the week, and it still produced fish. The crew arrived and got organised at various times through Friday

To say the fishing dropped off, is not probably correct. The line from a song "some days a diamond, some days a stone" summed it up. Some (Lloyd especially) found diamonds, a 85cm cod, one of three legals. Tom, fishing with him, didn't land a legal, but did get busted by a good fish, which left the lure floating for him to reclaim a couple of days later. All the cod where coming off points which were devoid of prominent fish holding features, and most came from the Stockyard Ck/ Glenrock arm. All the while the odd Golden took a lure, but never any hotspots. I think the tally of legal cod was close to ten, with at least 30 undersize fish released.

The week ended up on Friday night at the Dare's residence with Deb putting on a roast lamb dinner for all of us, and entertained by Brians "King Billy Coke Bottle" jokes, and all the banter that comes after a week of fishing with mates.

Mark Vievers Mackay Trip

We landed at Mackay on a Sunday with strong winds greeting us. I hoped these conditions weren't going to continue for the week's trip. Tuesday afternoon with the wind starting to drop, we headed for Kinchant Dam, 41km away in the Pioneer Valley, to fish for big





impoundment Barra. Kinchant Dam is all weed beds, no trees, so we fished plastic frogs with weedless hooks, on the surface, casting into the open pockets in the weed. We had a 1metre barra follow our frog pushing a big bow wave, but not hitting. We went back Wednesday afternoon for the same result, even trolling lure didn't produce a fish. Thursday morning we launched at Seaforth, a small coastal town north of Mackay to fish for pelagic. We trolled our barra lures near the offshore islands for a couple of mackerel and a estuary cod. As we headed out around the islands I was smashed by a big GT. Line peeled off the reel

as we chased it, pulling my arms almost from the shoulders as I played it. We finally landed it, took a photo and released it. The day ended after another couple of bustoffs by big fish
