

# **Tech Tips-** Tuning Hardbody Lures

Tuning hardbody lures usually involves getting the lure to track straight and not swim to one side or the other. Tuning can also be an interesting way of getting a little more from your favourite lure.

A lot of the higher end lures are tank tested and tuned out of the box, but they can get out of tune easily enough by banging them off structure or fish giving them the torture test and twisting them up on you. Other types don't have a fixed connection point on the bib or nose of the lure. These lures rely on a clip or link through the bib and are less likely to need fine-tuning because of the movement in the connection point to the line.

To test if a lure is in tune and swimming straight, drop it in the water and retrieve it at the speed you intend to swim it. If casting, cast the lure out a short distance and retrieve the lure at the speed you intent to fish it and take a note of the lure position over the last 3-4 metres of the retrieve. If trolling, drop the lure 2-3 metres back at the speed you intend to troll and note which way the lure is tending to run.

For basic tuning, if the Lure is swimming to the left then you need to bend the eye to the right to get the lure to swim straight. On small lures these adjustments are minute, by the time you feel the tow point move can easily be too much and best done a little at a time by putting pressure on the tow point in the direction you need to move it. You want to bend the tow point, not the lure bib

So gently does it is the go, otherwise you could break the tow point out of the lure. Goes without saying, That's not a good thing!

The faster the troll or retrieve the more noticeable any "out of tune" effect is. Sometimes "out of tune" isn't necessarily a bad thing. It can be used to swim the lure away from the back of the boat, or to swim it closer or under a piece of structure. A slightly out of tune lure will swim fairly straight on a slow retrieve, but by cranking the speed up a little you can swim the lure to swim toward the structure and get it closer or underneath an edge that you won't normally be able to do.

Knowing which way the lure is out of tune is helpful in getting the boat position right to be able to use this technique.

Of course if the lure is rolling over and blowing out of the water it really needs the pliers treatment, or it may be you are fishing it beyond the speed it was designed for and no amount of tuning will correct this.

With small lures, a pair of fine tipped pliers are required to get to the tow point of the lure without damaging the bib, they also allow for a better feel when only small movements are required. Generally by the time you feel movement you have gone too far. 
