

### Logan & Albert Fish Management Association, Tagging Weekend Upper Albert & Logan Rivers and Creeks 20 and 21<sup>st</sup> November, 2010

In 2006, Carpbusters Native Fish Stocking Association secured some funding from DPI&F to carry out a research project on the populations of stocked Mary River Cod and Australian Bass in the upper reaches of the Albert and Logan River systems. Part of that research is the tagging of cod and bass above Bromelton Weir on the Logan and above Luscombe Weir on the Albert. Carpbusters have invited SE Qld ANSA clubs to assist with the tagging part of the project.

## Tagging Weekend Upper Albert & Logan Rivers and Creeks. Continued



### Where

The camping and co-ordination point will be on the bank of the Albert River at Mark Ward's property at Kerry. (Mark is the president of Logan & Albert Fish Management Assoc). A pre determined group of canoes/kayaks will fish (If the water is safe and not flooding) sections of the Logan River along a stretch of the Rathdowney – Boonah Road.(water flows permitting) For those wishing to try Canungra Creek, arrangements will be made with the Canungra RSL Fishing Club to co-ordinate and arrange access points. (Please Note: Those wishing to fish Canungra Ck or canoe/kayak the Logan, please advise Lloyd ASAP)

### How to get there

**Mark's place:** (1916 Kerry Rd) From the crossroads at the centre of Beaudesert, take the Kerry road for approx 15km till you cross the Albert River for the first time. The entry to Mark's property is a couple of kms further on the RHS just past the old Kerry church (on the LHS). Enter the property and follow the road down to the river.

**Note:** Southern Brisbane's banner and/or Carpbuster's banner will be mounted on or near the entrance to Mark's property.

**Todd Bridge & Upper Logan River Road:** From Beaudesert, take the Mt Lindsay H'way to

Rathdowney. Take the Rathdowney-Boonah Rd just through town on the RHS for approx 8km to the turn off and Todd Bridge.

**Canungra Ck:** By arrangement through Lloyd.

### Basic flow of the weekend

It is envisaged that the majority of participants will arrive Saturday AM to register, set up any camping facilities they need, and maybe do a spot of fishing prior to lunch. Around lunchtime there will be a briefing session by Carpbusters on access points, fishing locations, protocol etc., and teams will form to fish the various locations on the Albert River or Christmas Ck for the afternoon/evening session. Sunday morning, groups will move off to fish the upper Albert or sections of Christmas Creek.

**Note:** Participants are welcome to arrive Friday evening and set up camp and stay as long as they like on Sunday.

For those who elect to Canoe/Kayak the Logan, I suggest we meet at the Rathdowney Information Centre (across the road from the hotel) around 7.30am Saturday (time can be changed as needed). It is envisaged that once the days fishing is complete that you make your way back to Mark's place at Kerry to camp the night and fish locally the next day. Same goes for those who elect to fish Canungra Ck.

### Fish Species

Australian Bass, Mary River Cod, Eel tailed catfish and Carp.

### Fishing Tips

Use bigger, wide action lures for cod. Cod lures that have worked for the locals are: spinner baits, orgee plow, tilsan bass, stumpjumper medium, halco scorpion. Bass can be caught on most lure types and sizes depending on their mood.

For carp, use worms or corn kernels (berley with creamed corn). Suspend bait under small float and adjust depth as necessary.

Rods can be either spinning or baitcasting and I would suggest nylon line in the 3/4kg class or 6/10lb braid.

### Regulations

Mary River cod	-	no take species (1 only in nominated impoundments)
Australian bass	-	2 in possession (min size 30cm)
Eel-tailed catfish	-	combined total of 5 fish (min size 35cm)
Carp	-	kill instantly and <i>do not</i> return to the water

### What to bring

This is a BYO everything weekend, including:- your own sleeping arrangement (tent, swag, panelvan or camper); food eating utensils and alcohol; a camping table and a chair; relevant fishing gear; tagging gun and club tags if you have them; suitable clothing (**note:** some stinging nettles and other nasties may exist on the banks); and suitable footwear for walking in the river/creek and banks eg. old Volley OC sandals (now I'm showing my age), dive boots or similar.

A canoe or kayak if you wish. There are a few large holes within a short distance of Marks' including one on his property at the camp site.

### What will be provided

Logan & Albert Fish Management Assoc (LAFMA) have made arrangements with Scenic Rim Council to provide a marquee, some chairs and toilets. A gas BBQ for cooking and campfire will be supplied by LAFMA, as well as some tags for those who need them.
