

# Albert River trip 6<sup>th</sup> September

It was the first weekend of Bass open season and it was time for our annual club Australian Bass Tagging trip in the lower Albert River. Australian Bass have a closed season from the 1<sup>st</sup> of June and reopens on the 1<sup>st</sup> of September. Bass will travel downstream to the brackish water to breed in the winter months. Nine club members in canoes, Kayaks and even a tinny attended this trip with a start time of 6.00am.



Lloyd Willman was trip captain as usual for this trip. Lloyd is also an active member of Carpbusters. Carpbusters is responsible for stocking the Albert River and Logan River with Bass and Cod in the upper sections. This benefits us down here in the lower Albert, so it is always good to give a bit back by tagging as many Bass as we can.

This was one of the best days I have had fishing in the Albert River. About 60 Bass were caught for the morning, average fish size would have been 30cm. The biggest fish was caught by Mark Veivers, which measured up as 40cm.



Geoff Daily and Eddie Latz provided entertainment for the day. These two took a tinnie on the trip and went a fair way up stream. The Albert gets fairly shallow in most places so judging by the profanities coming from Geoff's mouth well lets just say it was a lot of hard work in spots. But they persevered and were rewarded with a few nice fish.

Mark Veivers and Kevin Ford borrowed my spare canoe "Fintastic" for the morning. They had a ball, as it was the first time either had fished this section of the river. They tagged about 16 fish for the morning.



I tagged nine Bass from my black stealthy kayak. Most were caught on ecogear hardbody lures and two were caught with a yozuri Popper. At one stage a lure was hanging from an overhanging branch and a Bass was trying to grab it as it was touching the waters surface.



So if anyone catches one of the tagged Bass in the Albert River they should record the total length of the fish and the measurement to the fork of the tail. Also the date and place that the fish was caught will have to be recorded. The tag will have a number and also a phone number to call. The Suntag phone number is 1800 077 001. This was give valuable insight into growth rate and migration of our Albert River Bass.

#### Tech Tips-Drag settings

Depending on the species of fish we are targeting- we use a variety of drag settings in an estuary situation.

At the moment it is Flathead season. When targeting flathead we generally use a light drag setting as not to pull the hooks out of the fish if we get a light connection to the fish.

A bigger fish hits hard and the lighter gauge hooks on small minnow lures can also be put under some pressure so the lighter drag reduces this pressure on the hooks and the connection to the fish.

We really don't want to drop fish by pulling the lure out of them if they are only lightly hooked. We'll run light settings over open weed beds and only slightly higher drag setting over stretches of creeks near the entrances to drains and banks which hold bait are all that is required.

The logic we are using is based on Flathead not really being known as a dirty fighter.

Occasionally, a flathead may take you into a snag, but it's not that often. Usually we are pulling them over structure bringing them to the boat.

The lighter setting also makes it less likely to loose a lure if you tow it into a snag, a bunch of weed or old crab pot. Generally we can back up on the lure and it will float free or circle round and go over the spot and shake it out.

As we move into spring, early season Mangrove Jack or other harder fighter estuary species may be encountered, and it becomes more likely they will do you in a snag with a drag light setting. So you need to be prepared to drop a Flathead or two in a session using a higher drag and maybe score a Jack or loose a lure in the excitement of a bursting powerful run that is obviously not a flathead. If something unexpected hits, the only option you have is to try and thumb or palm the spool. Sometimes it works other times its not so successful. Almost certainly you need to be holding the rod when it goes off.

It's a price to pay either way, but with Flathead being the target species we are prepared to take the chance. Come closer to Summer we'll access the areas we are trolling and will step up in leader size and increase the drag setting and move to target Jacks instead of Flathead in some of the local trolling areas we've been targeting.

So we would be prepared to drop a Flathead if they're still in the area, but would be targeting the banks a bit tighter to structure in pursuit of a Mangrove Jack.

We would employ the same logic on Barra and Bass in the impoundments.

In open areas of the dams we would run lighter setting to avoid pulled or straightened hooks. If trolling the old creek beds, Weed beds and around identified snags, we would tighten up the drags and be prepared for a bust-off or to pull some hooks.

Give it a go, there not much better than hearing the drag going off and a good fish coming to the net.


