News Item: LAKE CESSBROOK UPDATE

My thanks to John Cumberland for these little snippets from the Toowoomba Chronicle 20/21 August 2004: "The camp ground and boat ramp at cressbrook are closed until further notice. Toowoomba city Council closed the camping ground due to a pump breakdown that supplies water to the showers and toilets. The boat ramp is closed to all trailered craft until further notice. Low water levels make it difficult to launch and retreive trailered boats safely. The ramp remains open to craft which can be launched by hand, such as small tinnies and canoes."

A local's comment in response to the above:

"I was told the camp ground re-opened this afternoon.

'The boat rap was a 😕 😕 disgrace. I pay rates and pay to get in, and they don't want to spend a brass razoo on the boat ramps.

'If you were foolish enough to reverse down the concrete part, you faced a drop of 6 to 8 inches onto the gravel before getting bogged in the rutts left by heroes in 4x4s spinning wheels whilst pulling their 12 foot tinnies out. I watched a bloke pull a 14 ft tinny out with an old Corolla one day, no trouble. Next came a Landcruiser, similar boat, clouds of dust and roaring engine, and he very nearly dug himself a hole big enough to lose the boat in. A bloody hero!

'The Cressy ramp was bad for a bit, when the water was on the crusher dust the council put down to "fix" the ramp, but once it got below that there weren't any dramas." The fishing hasn't been great, but still enough to keep interest up and a bit of size to them too, which is nice...

Fishing Clinics to Encourage Girls to Fish Too

In a bit of a contradiction of some of its apparently Anti-Fishing policies (See article further on), the Queensland Government is running fishing clinics for kids.

"Under the State Budget handed down last month, funds have been allocated for at least a further 15 clinics to be held this financial year," Mr Palaszczuk said.

'At each clinic, up to 40 children are introduced to fishing by officers of the DPI&F and Queensland Boating and Fisheries Patrol as well as Fishcare volunteers. Each child receives a free rod, reel and equipment.

The venues for future clinics are Groper Creek (Burdekin region), Barney Point Beach (Gladstone), Paradise Point (Gold Coast) and Lions Park (Burrum Heads). For details, contact the Department.

The Queensland Government has announced its plans for complimentary(?) zoning in Great Barrier Reef State waters. Details of the plan are on the web at http://www.epa.qld.gov.au/parks_and_forests/marine_parks/proposed_gbr_zoning/

Mr Bill Turner, Chairman of SUNFISH Qld, today said that recreational fishers in Queensland are wondering when the closing down of areas to recreational fishing is going to stop. We are being hit from every side by commonwealth and state agencies all concentrating on shutting down fishing.

In effect the latest proposal by the EPA Minister will see an additional shutdown of a further 20% of Queensland's coastline between high and low water to all fishing activity, and another 10% of restricted yellow zones, he said. Considering that anglers have already lost access to 33% of fishing areas in the past few weeks, statements by the Minister that "these additional closures will benefit recreational fishers" are being met with disbelief and anger by 800,000 recreational fishers.

Mr Bateman , EO of SUNFISH Qld, said that the Minister would have everyone believe that the "yellow areas" stop commercial fishing. Anglers should be aware that 400m commercial bait nets (allowed to take fish for sale), crab pots and commercial line fishing are still allowed in the proposed areas.

76% of Queensland's recreational fishers use this shoreline to go fishing, and to shut areas, just to conform, is not acceptable he said. It will affect jobs in tourism, accommodation, boat sales, tackle and bait shops and reduce fishing expenditure.

Mr Turner said that recreational fishermen in Queensland over the past 2 years have experienced a massive amount of closures without reliable scientific information to back the decisions. These proposed closures are no exception and have no scientific basis for their introduction.

This latest proposal follows recreational fishing closures by the GBRMPA, the State Government Coral Reef fishing closures, Grey Nurse Shark closures, and catch restrictions on a range of nearly all recreationally caught fishes, he said.

In the opinion of most recreational fishers, this is just another opportunity for the "conservation arm" of governments to implement fishing closures, Mr Turner said. The worst aspect is that it is not encouraging anyone to take up the sport.
