<u>Trip Report – Flathead tagging Jumpinpin 26th September</u>

Congratulations to the trip committee for choosing the day for the annual 'Pin Flathead tagging trip. It was an absolutely picture perfect day, sunny, blue skies with light variable wind all day. Blue moons come around more regularly than weather like this occurring on a weekend. Unfortunately numbers were down, with only 3 members taking advantage of the perfect weather. Bob Hartley and friend, Kev Ford and myself fishing solo.



The weather was so good, it brought out every type of watercraft known to man, from rubber tubes to 90ft luxury cruisers. The most unusual was a motorised hang glider with a inflatable dinghy complete with outboard, that laded at the 5 Ways. I didn't see any fishing gear on board, but could see some potential for reaching remote locations. The fishing was good, without being spectacular, although Kev might disagree. I finished the day with 12 Flathead, all tagged and released except for one. The best going 58cm. My effort was concentrated around the edge of the weed beds at north Tipplers Passage and around the main channel leading back towards the junction with Jacob's Well channel, an area that has produced croc size fish in the past.

Kev arrived, close to low tide and was trolling 50m behind me hooked up, and landed a 75cm Dusky. To say he was rapt, is an understatement. I'm going to take some credit, as it was my lure that stirred the fish in time to see Kev's lure come past. He had



fished Cobby Passage earlier for 4 Flathead which included a 63cm fish. His total for the day was 9. Bob Hartley wasn't having much luck, hooking a few, but losing them on the way to the net. Unfortunately, the trip attendance was down like last year, which is a shame because it provides a great opportunity to improve Flathead luring, as it is at this time of the year the Duskies at willing to take all types of lures leading up their spawning season.

Trip Report - Albert River Bass Tagging below Wolfdene Bridge

This is normally one of Lloyd's pet trips, but unfortunately he is at the ANSA state meeting. What a difference from the trip last year. No rain, but bloody freezing, I'm sure there was frost in the hollows. I arrived at first light to see Eddy Latz and JC with their canoes ready to go. While I was unloading the





bridge. You had to put the casts tight into the cover, About 20 Bass in total from 28 to 32cm with the majority at 29cm. All silver as tidal Bass seem to be, a bit on the lean side,

camo mini bass boat, Kev, Chris Lund and Neil McNeil arrived, followed shortly after by Mal with his new state of the art super yak. Kev, JC and I, disappeared into the freezing cold mist leaving the others to get organised. JC was first off the mark with a 29cm Bass on the ever reliable Mazzi Popper, and I trolled up a Bass the same size a few minutes later. The flotilla now moved up the river, all complaining about cold feet, hands and other body parts. Boy, was that sun welcome when it popped over the ridge tops. The fish weren't biting their heads off, but everyone pulled fish all the way up the



whether after spawning or being male fish. They seemed to be schooling, with Mal pulling 4 fish and dropping 2 on one snag just below Wolfdene bridge. At about 10am we all moved back down, with about another 6 or so yaks moving up. Not the secret spot it used to be.



We had the wind at our backs on the way back, but a making tide, which made things a bit difficult for Mal when his inadequate battery gave out leaving him to paddle. My towing capability again came into play. (have to charge soon). We all arrived at the causeway at midday, loaded up, some of us stopping for a sausage sizzle and a yarn. A well attended and successful trip.
